The engineering and construction industry is in crisis. McKinsey & Co. reports that 98% of projects fail to achieve stated business objectives, and a longer-term industry outlook from EY suggests that project delivery success is actually decreasing. Cost overruns and schedule delays are now the norm, with research from Oxford University indicating that nine out of ten megaprojects experience both. These repeated and measurable failures in the existing approach to project delivery must be addressed.

One major contributing factor is the engineering and construction industry's current approach to supply chain management. Project Production Institute (PPI) research indicates that the supply chain network is dominated by contracting and procurement thinking, which leads to unintended consequences such as increased cost, schedule duration, risk of safety incidents and reduced quality.

Effective supply chain management must consider not only contracting and procurement strategies, but must also address production-related factors including the physical flow of materials, supplier lead time and control of work-in-process.

Speakers and invited participants from industry and academia, including representatives from BHP, Chevron, Google, Microsoft, Sasol, Stanford and UC Berkeley will convene at PPM Week 2017 to better understand the influence supply chains have on overall project outcomes and the role that effective PPM has in addressing the issue.

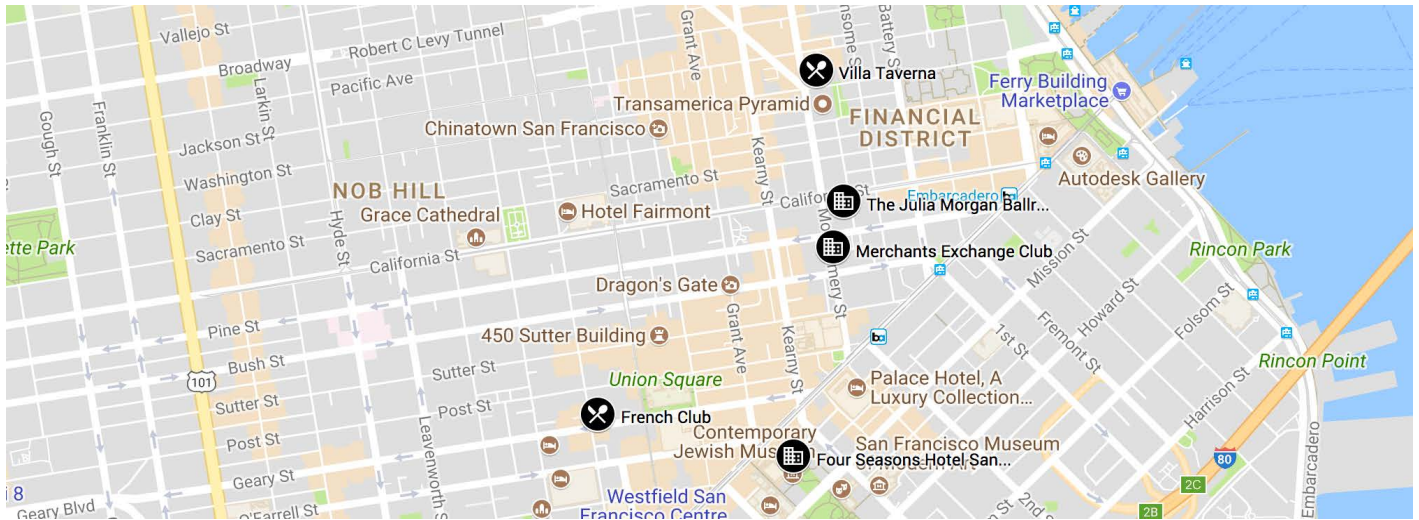
